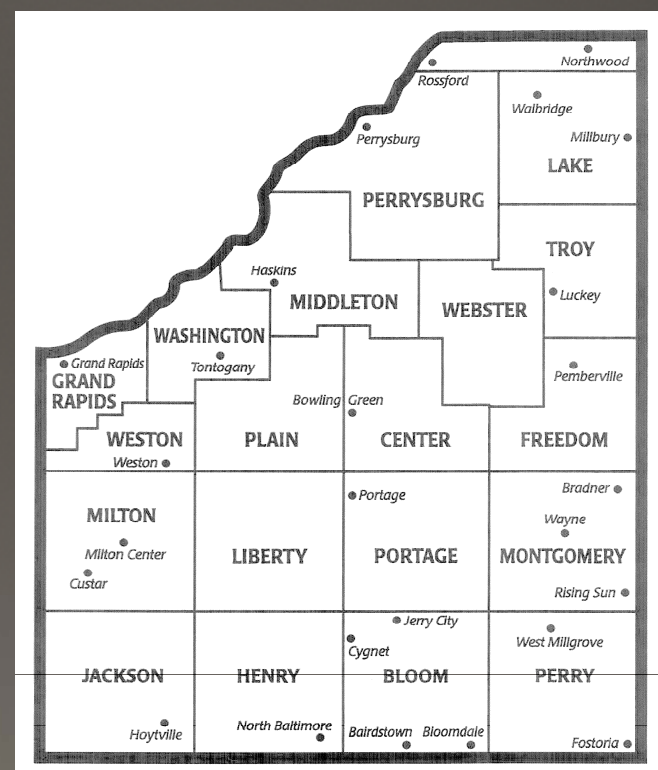

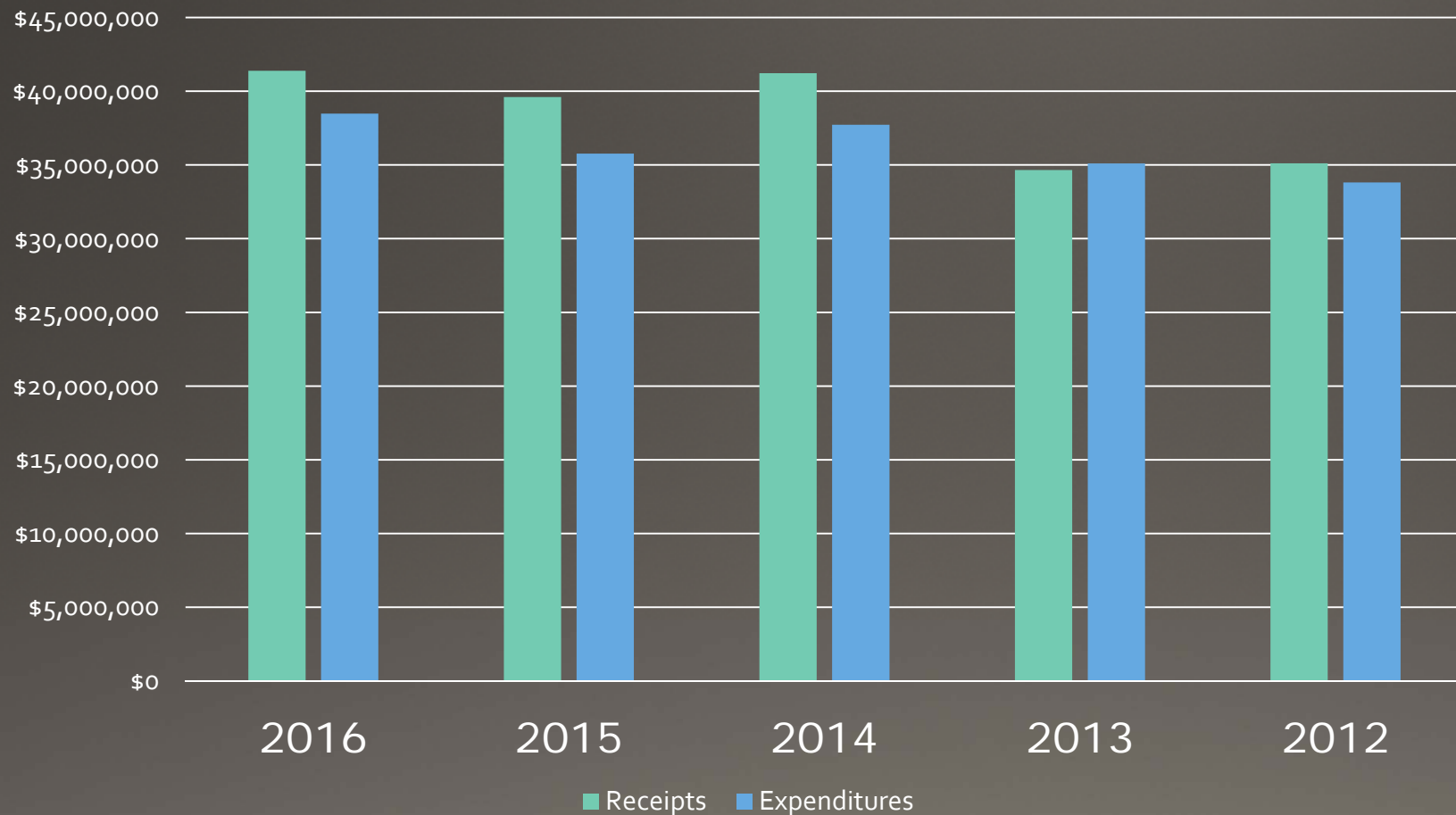

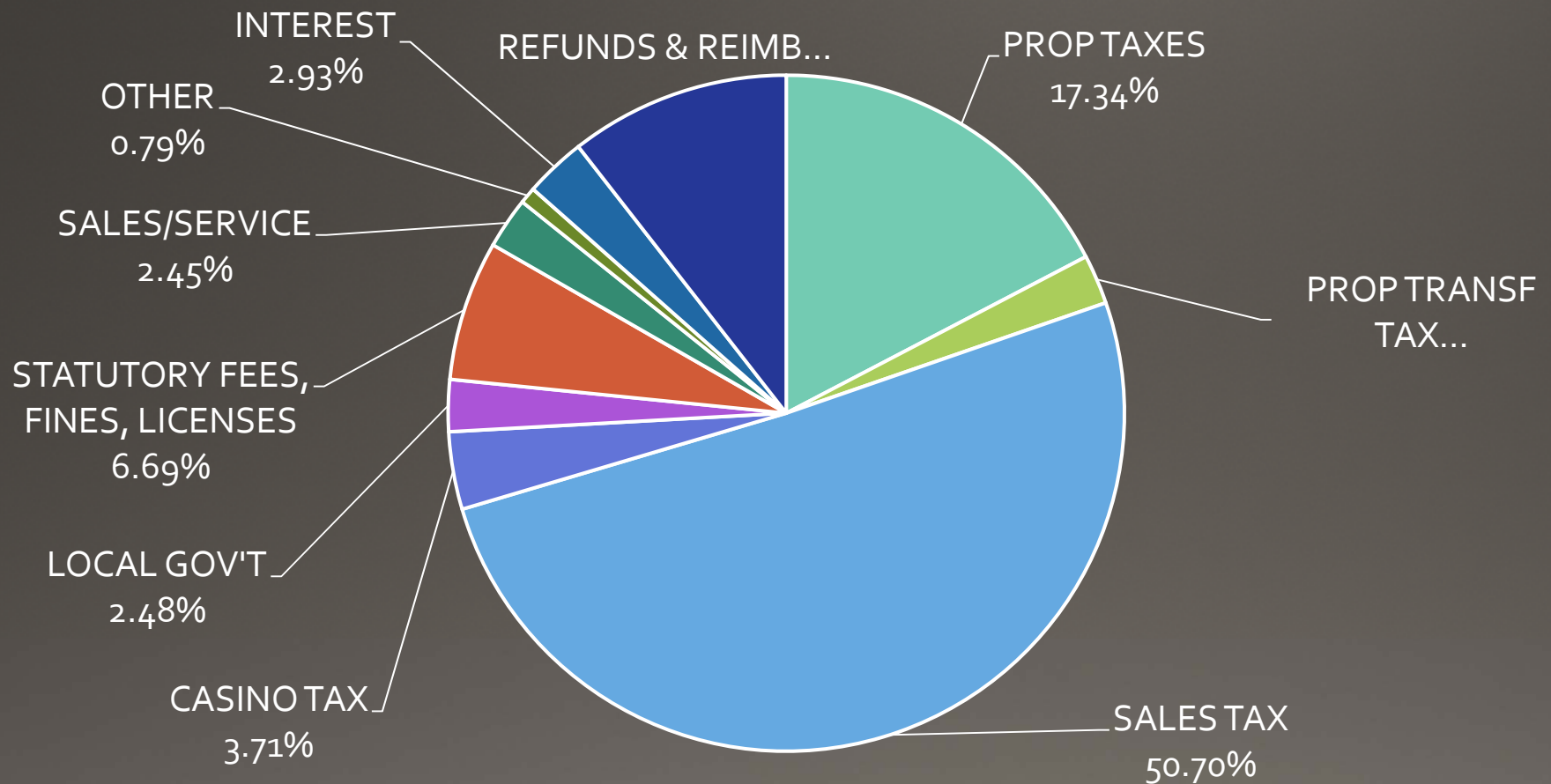

General Fund Receipts & Expenditures 2012 - 2016



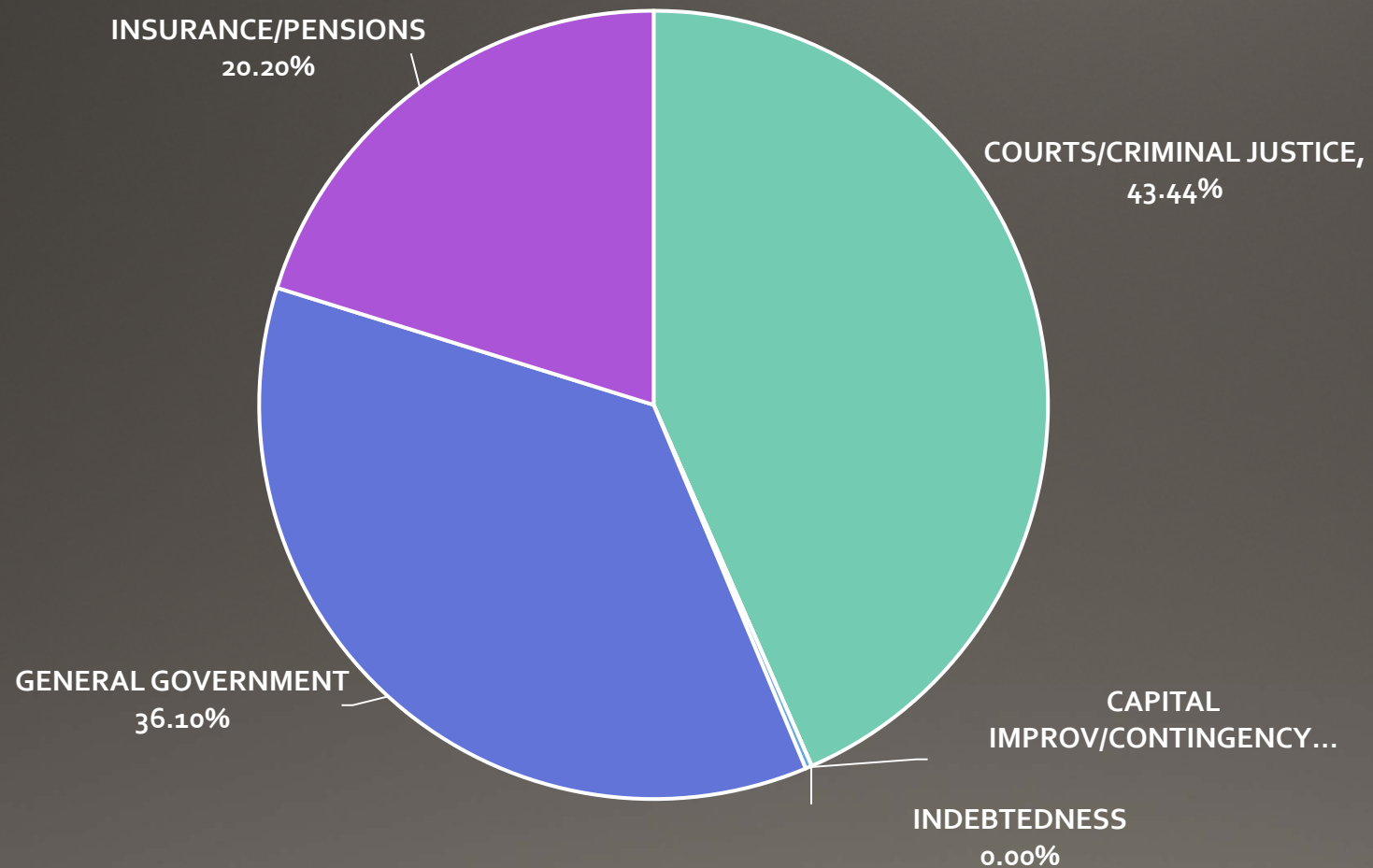

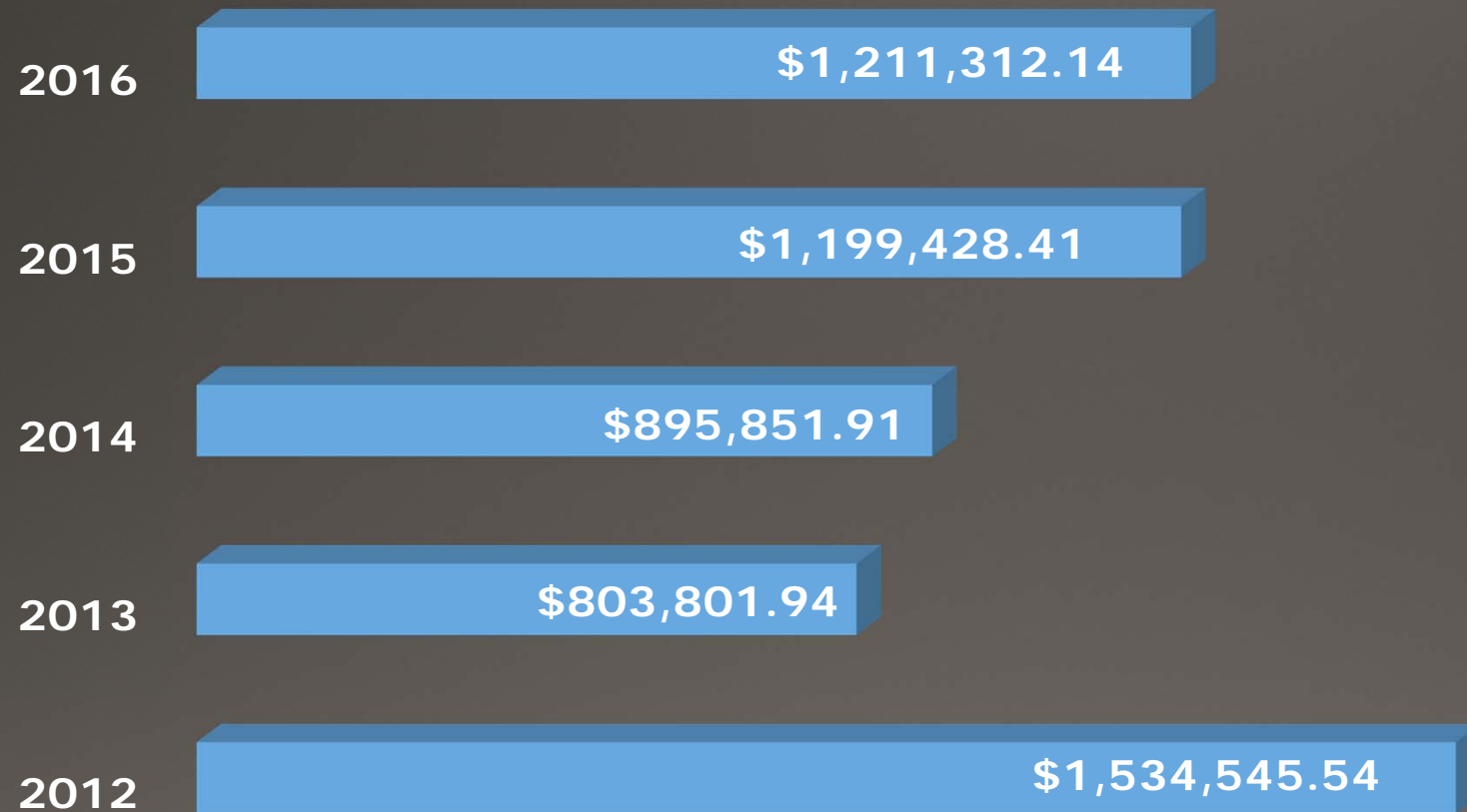


2016 Actual Expenditures

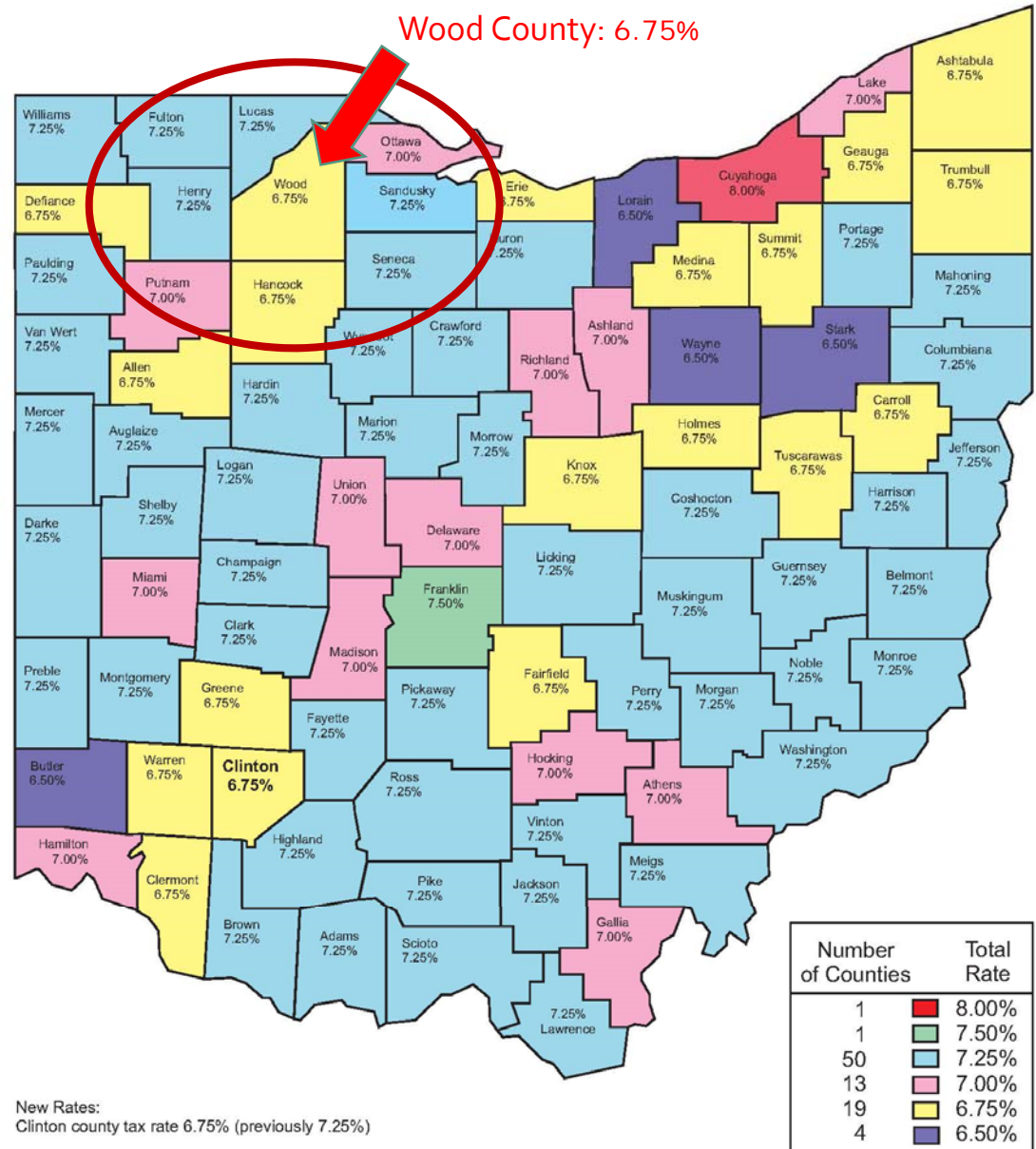
The Power of a Penny!

The most significant benefit of shopping locally is your support of local retailers and our local economy.

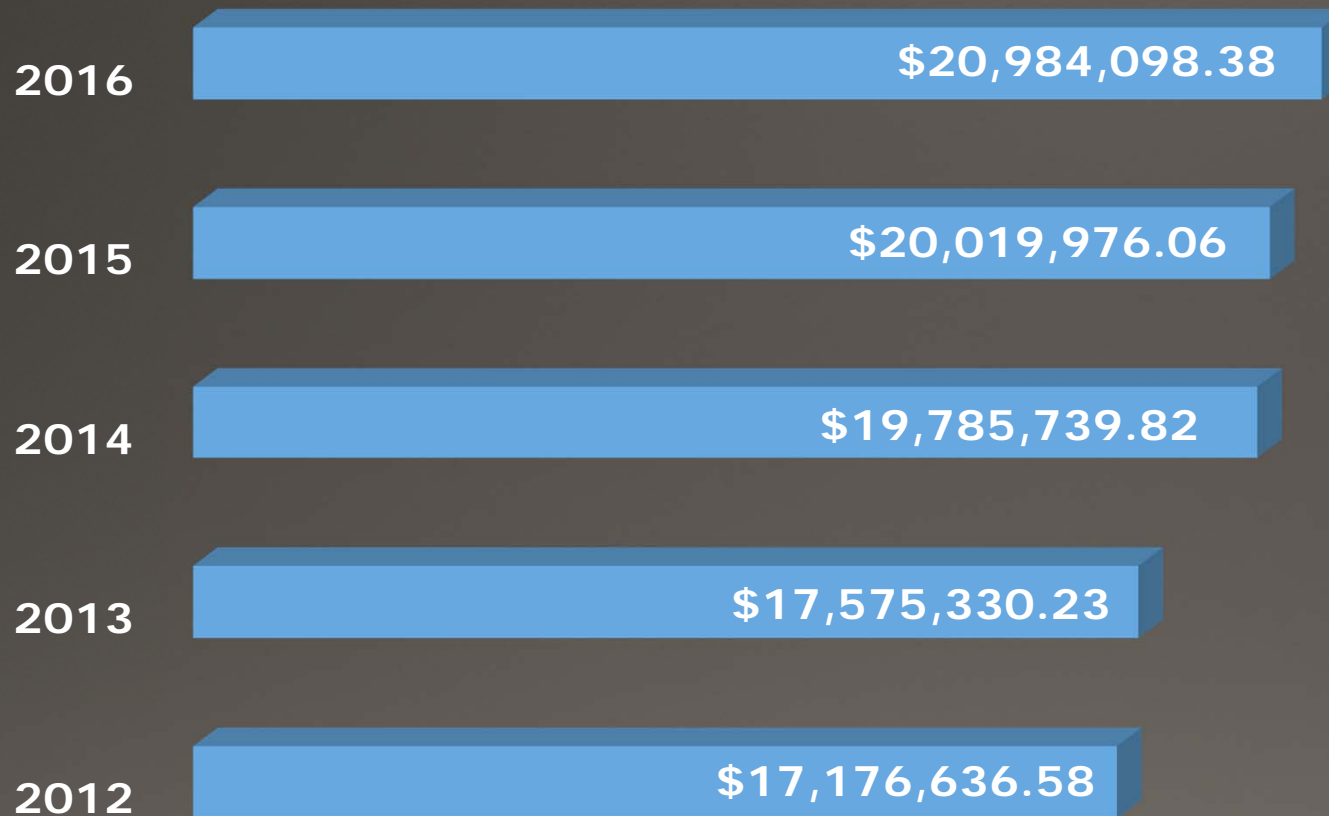
Total State and Local Sales Tax Rates, By County

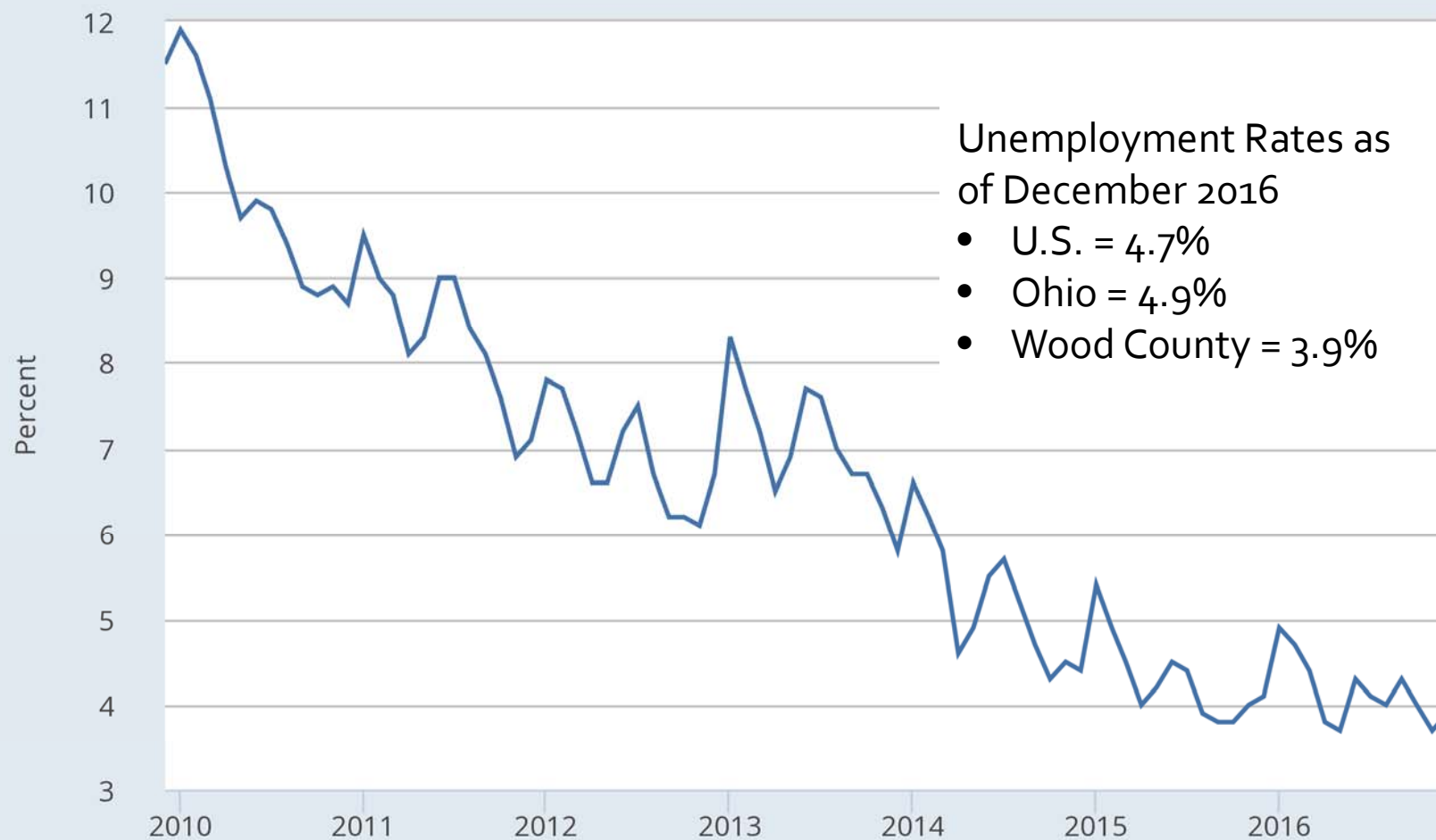

Wood County's unemployment rate remains under both the U.S. and Ohio averages.

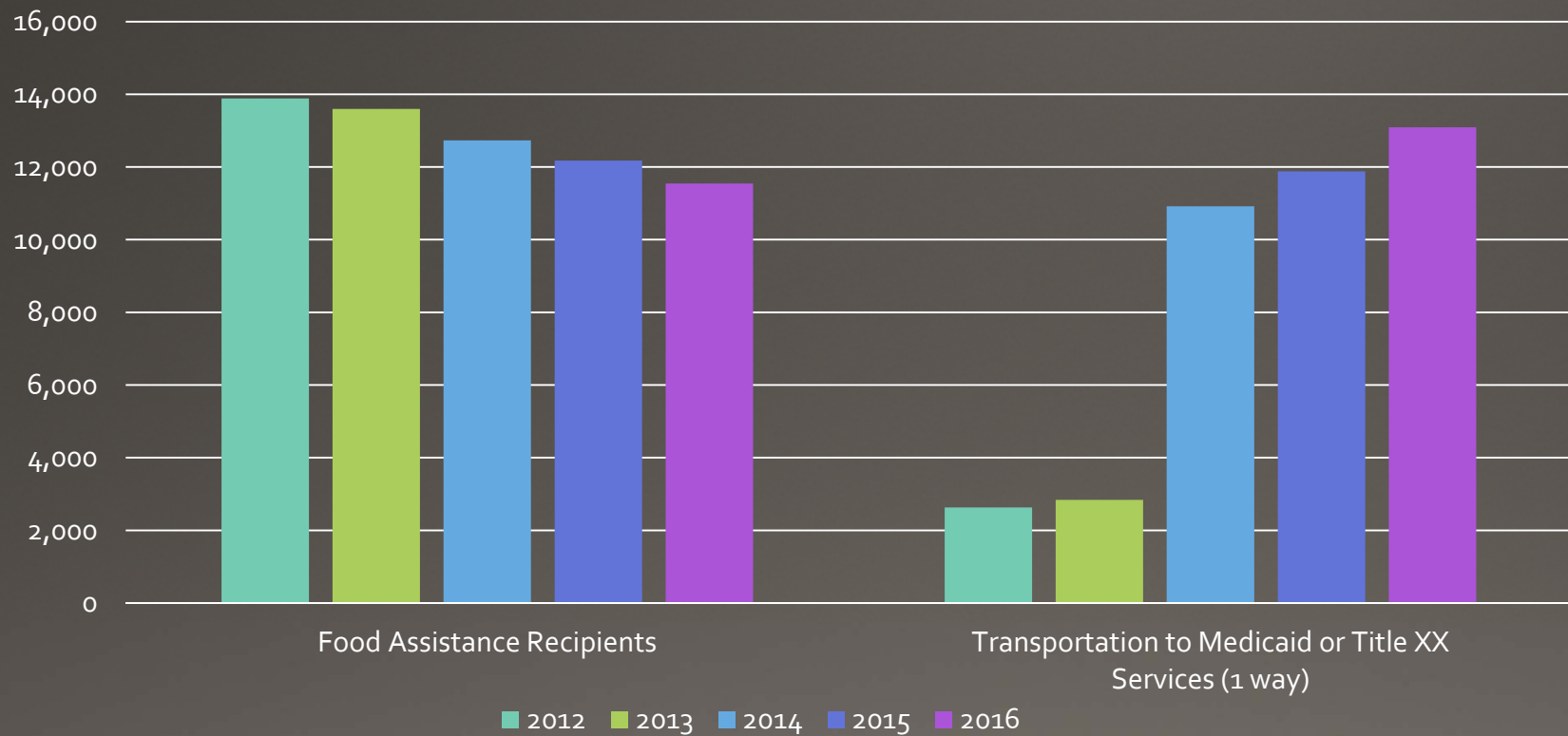

They also received a pair of shoes to begin the new school year.

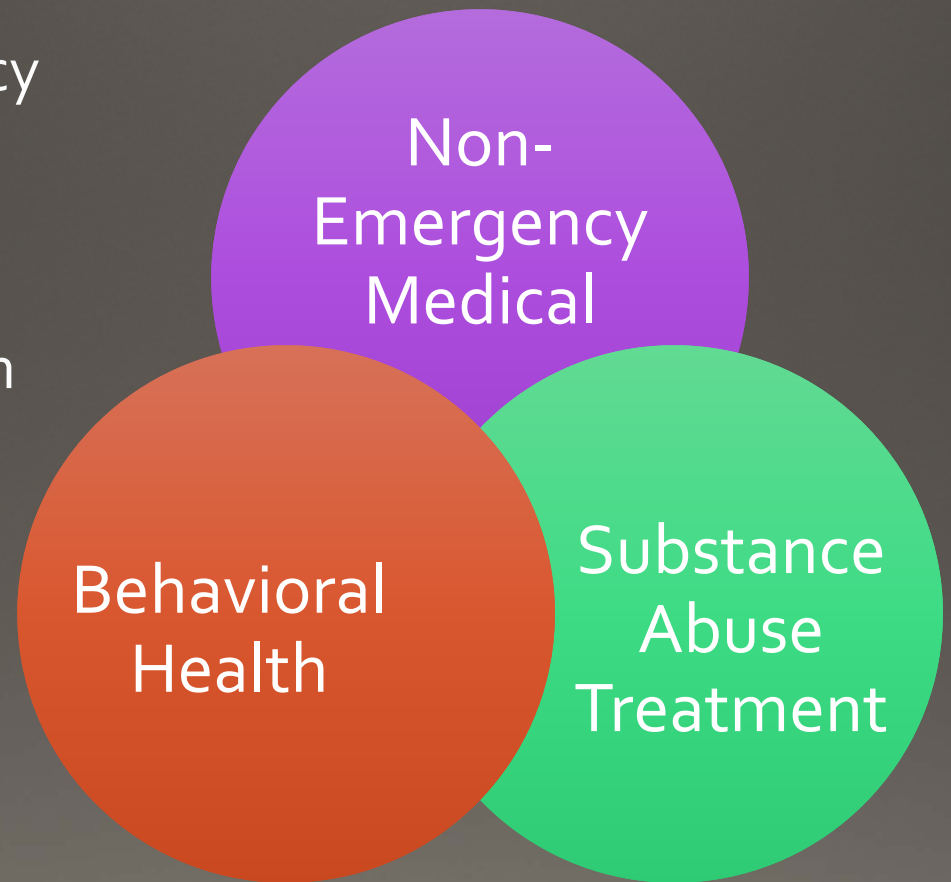

Resident room climate control units were added as part of a project to completely replace the aging piping system throughout the facility.

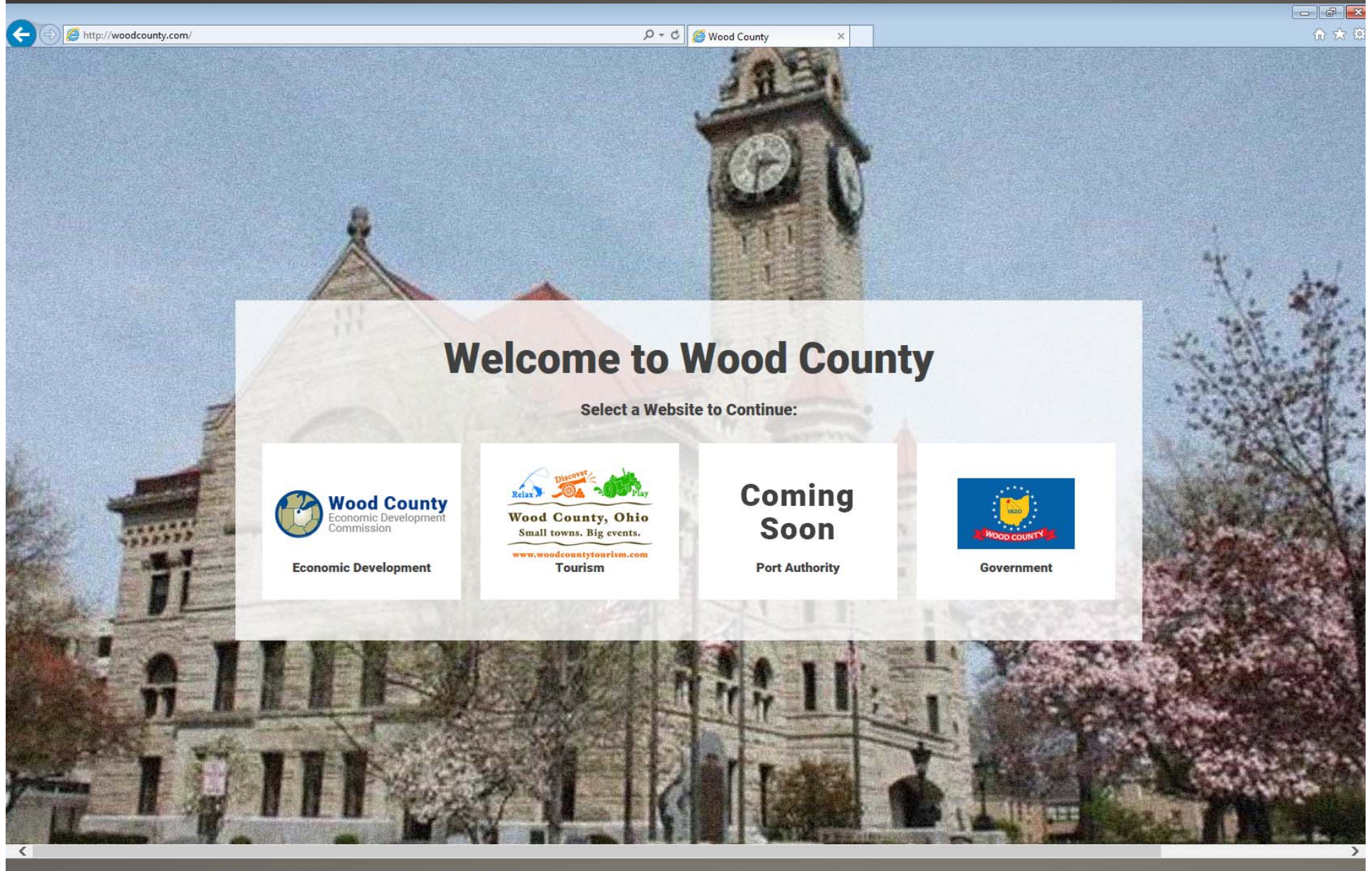

Plan reviews and inspections for school construction projects kept staff busy.

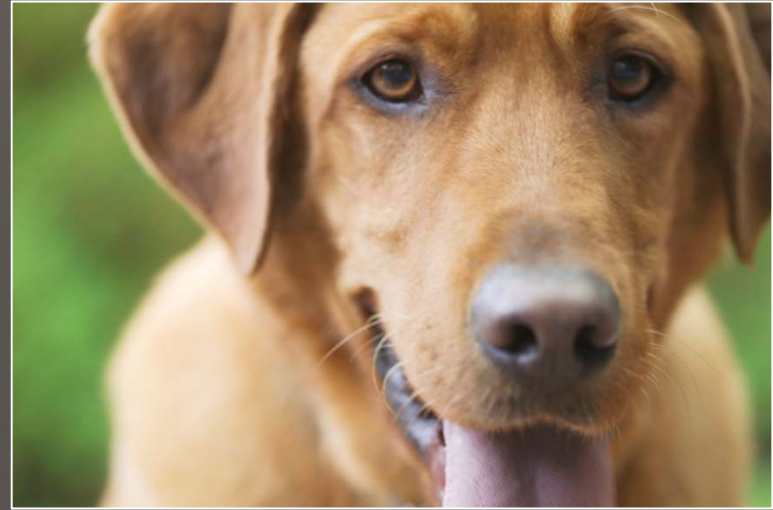
Five school districts had projects underway in 2016. Each resulting in approximately 150 inspections.

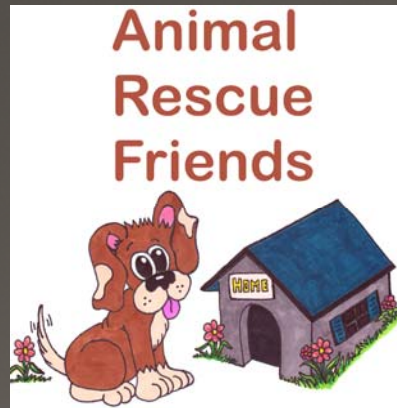

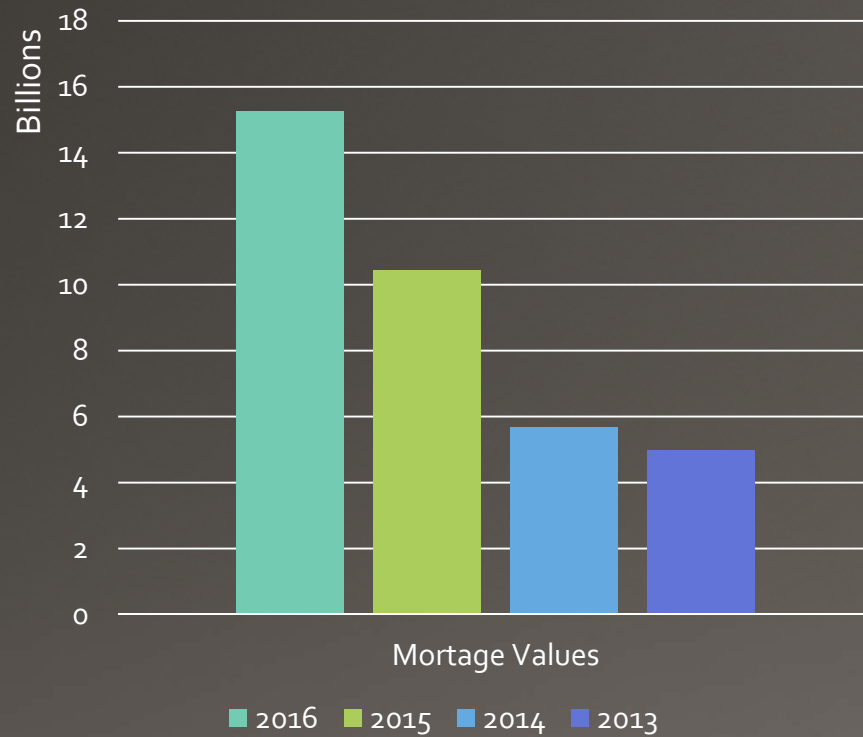

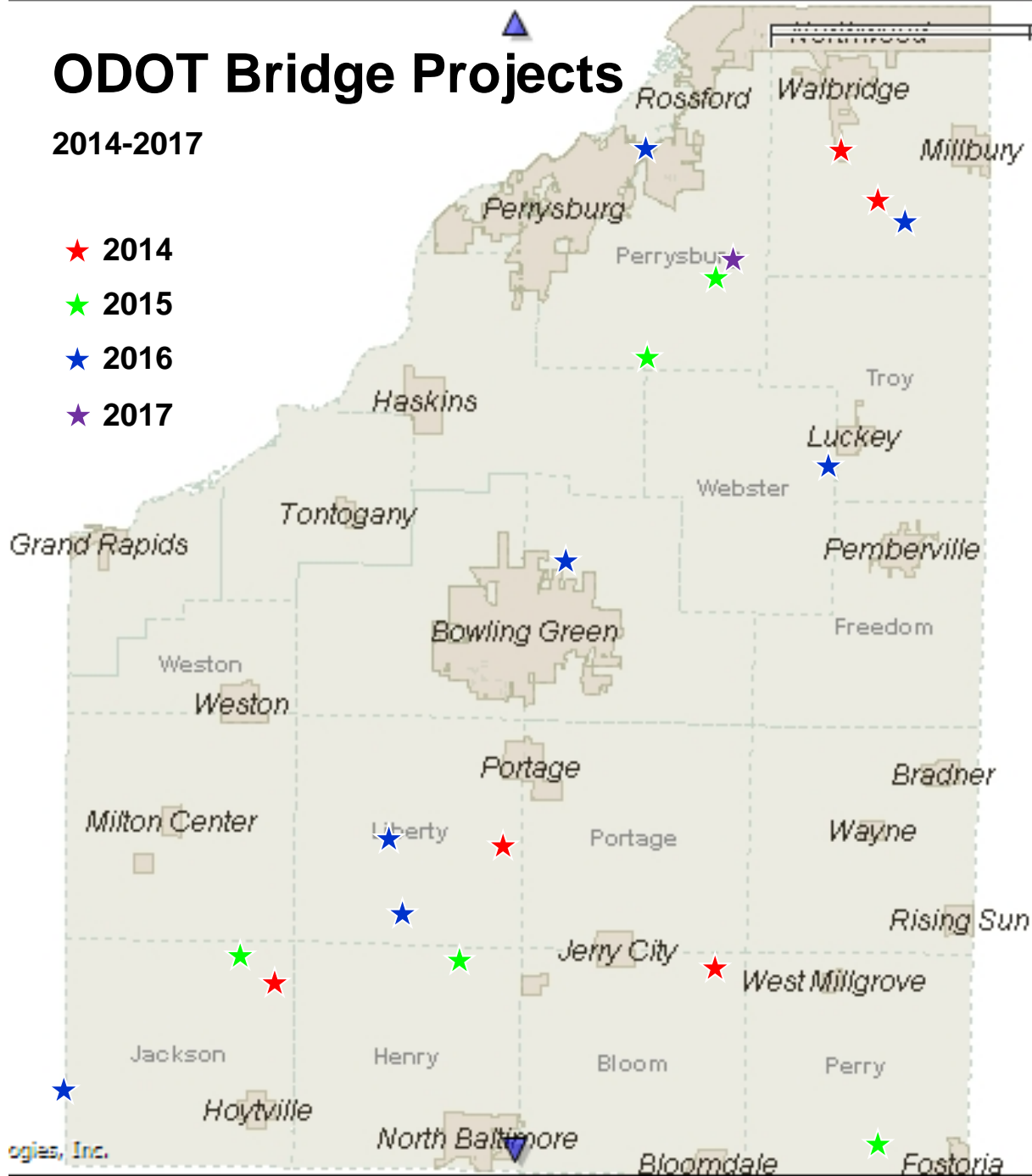

Ask Before You
Change.



- If you have farmland that drains into one watershed, but are considering re-tiling so that the land drains into a different watershed.
- An initial meeting with the Engineer's Office will determine if such a change is feasible based on the drainage capacity of the proposed new watershed.
- The petition process required to make this kind of drainage change is outlined in ORC §6131.

Auto Title Transitions to New Statewide Titling System

The new system required staff to complete a set of five training modules over the course of five months.



Project Lifesaver

Provided by the Wood County Sheriff's Office

Project Lifesaver is an active response to the problem of locating people who may not be able to find their way home – before they become victims.

The Project Lifesaver team is trained to approach a person with Alzheimer's disease or a developmental disability, gain their trust, and put them at ease for the trip home.

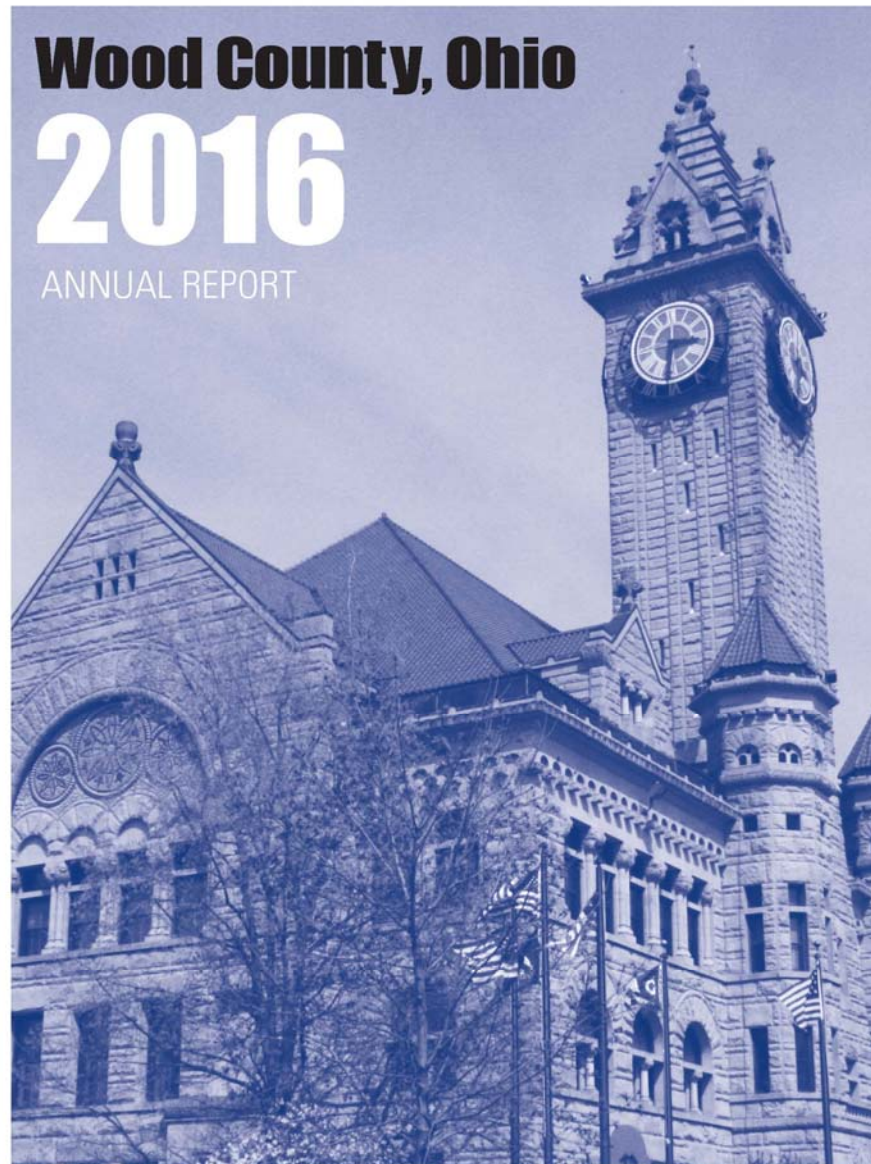
